When grace is preached many pastors feel obligated, sometimes by **congregational** pressures and expectations, to “balance” a series of messages on grace with another series on holiness. “After all,” goes the thinking, “we don’t want the congregation to overdose on grace. Where would that lead? They might abuse their **freedom in Christ.**” God does call us to holiness and good character, but it is never given as a precondition to our standing in Christ. The shift from grace to works often leaves the hearer focusing on striving to be good enough to please God, and that is Bad News Religion.

God’s grace turns human ideas about fairness and justice upside down. God’s grace changes everything. There are many people like Javert who cannot accept God’s grace and will not allow themselves to be freed from the bondage of their lives. They choose slavery to sin and our world instead of the **freedom in Christ** God offers us by his grace.

The good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ is that God has found us and that he has delivered us from sin, not because we are good, but because he is good. We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, and in Christ alone. That’s incredible, amazing good news!
