Though they’re more **common** than we may think, they’re still relatively rare—which means that for most people, a sudden and **complete healing** isn’t going to happen. But that doesn’t mean God is absent. It doesn’t imply that we are **cast adrift** to face our struggles on our own.

Christians will experience **complete healing** when the time comes for God to restore everything. Until then, we live in the times of refreshing. The healing process has begun. But we **should not** assume from the healing of the lame beggar that every last person who trusts in Jesus during this age will receive complete physical healing now. Sometimes God will allow us to struggle with **physical** or **emotional** wounds in order to show us that his grace is sufficient (2 Cor. 12:7–11).
